Letter from our Spiritual Advisor

Have you ever been to or watched a Protestant revival? Frequently at the close of service, the Preacher invites the new Christians to come to the Altar or front of the auditorium to make a "declaration of Faith" and "turn their life over to Jesus!"

I have been asked why we do not do this as Catholics?

The short answer is we do. At every Mass we are given the opportunity to receive Communion. As the Eucharistic Minister holds up the Host and says "The Body of Christ." Our response is "Amen."

Amen—so be it! Firm, fixed, or sure. I was taught it means "Yes, Lord I BELIEVE!"

We are responding to an Altar call affirming what we believe. I am told that many Catholics and Protestants believe the Host is symbolic. We Catholics believe it is the true Body and Blood of Christ. CCC1322-1498

I implore all believers to read John 6:53—56 "Jesus said...unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood you do not have life within you."

Then in John 6:66 we are told "As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied Him." Jesus did not run after them and say oh, I meant it symbolically. He let them go!

What are your thoughts on the Eucharist? Our Church calls it "the source and summit of the Christian Life." CCC1324

Ponder or meditate on your beliefs in Holy Communion.

And, the caseworkers at the conference level who bring hope, help and Christ into the homes of our neighbors in need...we are truly blessed with such sacrifice and devotion by our volunteers that make our SVdP Mission possible.

Help Make A Difference In Someone's Life Today... VOLUNTEED!!

St. Vincent de Paul offers many volunteer opportunities...there's something here for you!

Caseworkers: Caseworkers work through our 8 local Catholic Parishes in Naples. Last year, over 200 volunteer caseworkers assisted more than 30,000 children and adults from our community, conducting one-to-one interviews with each individual to determine what type of assistance is needed: food, rent, utility bills, clothing, furniture or household items. Caseworkers coordinate with other area agencies to provide the required assistance, with the ultimate goal of helping applicants find stability in their lives.

Meals on Wheels: Each year over 150 dedicated volunteers deliver over 41,000 meals to homebound, older and disabled adults in Collier County. As a volunteer driver you will help to deliver hot meals during the week and spend a few welcomed minutes visiting with recipients.

Thrift Stores: Through the help of donors and our volunteers, over \$30,000 was given in in-kind store goods last year, i.e., furniture, clothing, household goods.... Thrift store volunteers are trained to work in many areas of our thrift stores, including: receiving donations, straightening, sorting and pricing clothing, linens, household goods, books, furniture and electronics, answering telephones and cashiering.

Food Pantry: Last year over \$531,000 was given in food through our Choice Pantry. As a food pantry volunteer you can help to walk those we serve through the pantry and help with their choices or you can help in sorting and stocking the food donations.

HOMe: One of our newest programs, meaning Homeless Outreach Ministry, etc. Once a week volunteers assist our Homeless neighbors in need through clothing, toiletries, and other necessities to help during their time of need. Caseworkers provide hands on casework and other volunteers assist with the hot lunch and fellowship.
