SVdP Naples Installs New Council President

John Javaruski of St. Agnes Conference has become the president of the Society of St. Vincent DePaul Naples District Council, effective October 1, 2024. He will serve a three year term.



Moving to Naples in 2018, he and his wife Fran became members of St. Agnes Church and immediately became interested by the work of the SVdP Society. Joining SVDP in 2020, he became the Treasurer of the St. Agnes Conference, moving up to Council Treasurer in 2022.

John has a strong belief rooted in the teachings of the New Testament that reference the importance of helping those in

need. Citing St. James, "What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well,' but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead."

His SVdP Agenda includes:

- Enhancing the operations of the SVdP thrift stores, the food pantry, and the Meals on Wheels program
- Creating a Five Year Strategic Plan encompassing SVdP programs, fundraising efforts, and locations
- Making all SVdP locations attractive places to work and volunteer
- Ensuring that all of our conferences have the resources to help our neighbors adequately

John and his wife Fran are both Vincentians and have been married for 47 years. They have three children and two grandchildren.

Naples' Conference Re-Cap

St. Agnes Conference continues to grow in members, assistance given and holiness. The **Feast of St. Vin**-

cent dePaul was marked with a celebration of Mass attended by Conference members.

St. Ann Conference is home to the Mini-Vinnies, a group of sixth, seventh, and eighth graders at St. Ann School in Naples. The group is dedicated to helping those in need and in September collected over 500 jars of peanut butter and jelly that were donated to the SVdP Naples Pantry.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Conference fields more requests for assistance than any other Conference in Naples. Historic records were set in August for the number of families that received food and financial assistance.

St. Finbarr Conference elected a new president, Colleen DelDebbio. Colleen became the Conference servant leader on October 1, succeeding Anita Creamer. The Conference held a celebratory Mass and Brunch on October 20th to honor the Conference founding members, Tessie and Carlos LaMadrid.

St. John the Evangelist Conference has had a busy summer, adding and training new members. The group also laid out plans for new Vinnie Van project, and its annual Thanksgiving Food Drive.

St. Peter the Apostle Conference celebrated the **Feast of St. Vincent dePaul** by attending Mass as a group. The Conference banner was placed on the altar for the Mass, and the homily centered on the virtues and teachings of the Society's Patron Saint.

SVdP Vincentian Spotlight

Our volunteer spotlight shines brightly on Ellen Cordoba from St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Conference.

Ellen traces her dedication to service to her mother and recalls wanting to become a nurse at an early age. Graduating from college, she joined the Peace Corp, serving as a volunteer in Costa Rica for two years and also managing a Health Agency there. Married to a Costa Rican doctor, Ellen and her husband moved to Naples, where she practiced nursing for 35 years. Using her learned Spanish,

much of her time was spent with the indigent population of Collier County, helping people stay healthy and out of the hospital.

After a year of restless retirement, Ellen heard about the Society and became a member of the St. Elizabeth Seton Conference in 2018. She found an affinity for doing case work—especially in the Hispanic community, where she was able to put her Spanish skills to good use. She faces the challenges of working with neighbors in the working class neighborhoods of Golden Gate City, where there is a shortage of volunteers and resources to serve this economically deprived area.

It can sometimes become overburdening, however, Ellen finds that an encouraging word from a fellow Vincentian or a thank you from a neighbor brings inspiration to keep at it. "The Society teaches us to follow Christ through service to those in need, and the marrying of my Catholic upbringing and my nursing career, I can bear witness to the compassionate and liberating love of Christ."

In a world that has become divisive and entangled in political and religious wars, I can find peace in the spirituality and friendship of my fellow Vincentians in our service to those in need of comfort both spiritual and economical.


