WHAT IS SVdP Naples?

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul, Naples District Council, Inc. ("SVdP Naples"), part of a worldwide, privately-funded Catholic lay organization, delivers Meals on Wheels, teaches Life Skills, and provides Financial, Food & Furniture Assistance to homebound seniors and adults, low-income individuals, and working families in Collier County.

SVdP Naples is a District Council formed by SVdP Conferences inside seven (7) Collier County Catholic churches, from which each volunteer president serves on the SVdP Naples Board of Directors. The seven conferences, along with the general public, supply SVdP Naples with volunteers for its Meals on Wheels and Life Skills Programs, as well as volunteer case workers for its Financial, Food & Furniture Assistance Program.

Founded upon Catholic principles and operating in our community since 1964, SVdP Naples welcomes volunteers, grantors and donors, as well as seniors, individuals, and families seeking assistance. Help is given to everyone in need, regardless of race, creed or color.

SVdP Naples is privately-funded through gifts, grants and donations from individuals, families, businesses, foundations and community groups, as well as the net profit from two (2) Thrift Stores (Naples & Bonita Springs). SVdP Naples receives no funding from the Catholic Church or local/state/federal government.

SVdP Naples operates the largest privately-funded Meals on Wheels (MOW) operation in Collier County, delivering nearly 50,000 meals each year to our homebound, infirmed, or nutritionally-deficient seniors and disabled neighbors.

Each delivery day, SVdP Naples MOW volunteers honor our seniors by delivering a nutritious meal, sharing a prayer and exchanging smiles and small talk with our homebound neighbors. Oftentimes, a MOW visit is the only personal interaction our homebound seniors will experience that day.

SVdP NAPLES Financial, Food & Furniture Assistance

SVdP Naples provides financial, food and furniture assistance, as well as financial guidance and life skills training, to Collier County individuals and families facing a temporary financial crisis.

After a thorough factual review, SVdP Naples volunteer caseworkers arrange for the disbursement of rent, utilities, food, furniture or household goods to help qualified applicant families experiencing an economic challenge. Rent, utilities and other financial assistance is paid directly to the third-party landlord, utility

company, or vendor for the benefit of the applicant family. Food and furniture assistance is provided through the SVdP Naples Choice Pantry and Thrift Stores, allowing the family to reallocate their existing budget to solve the financial crisis.

SVdP Naples helps Collier County working families reestablish economic stability and prevent defaults and evictions which would cause negative "domino effects" for the family, their employer and our community.

Since 2018, SVdP Naples has provided temporary financial assistance to individuals and families working for 350+ local employers.

- Hundreds of dedicated volunteers serve as SVdP Naples financial assistance caseworkers, Choice Pantry workers and thrift store employees

SVdP NAPLES Life Skills Program -

In 2021, SVdP Naples created the Life Skills Program to provide Collier County residents with financial literacy (money management, budgeting, credit use & repair), employment opportunities, and job search skills. While traditional nonprofits can help an individual or family "weather a temporary financial storm," SVdP Naples prefers to help build self-sufficiency in our neighbors through financial literacy and employment skill-building.

The Life Skills Program equips every willing Collier County adult with the skills necessary to take charge of their family's financial future... to earn more, save more, and spend less. Classes are offered free of charge and all participants are encouraged to graduate by completing the entire series of classes.

LEARN & EARN

A series of 90-minute classes teaching Collier County families how to earn more, save more, and spend less.

SVdP NAPLES Thrift Stores

SVdP Naples operates thrift stores in East Naples (3810 Tamiami Trail E.) and Bonita Springs (3725 Bonita Beach Road). While a source of net income, the thrift stores enable SVdP Naples to provide other invaluable services to residents of our community.

Free Donation Pick-ups: With one quick call to SVdP Naples, area residents access a cost-free, hassle-free method of donating used furniture, clothing, household good, and other items, saving residents money and our community valuable landfill space.

Furniture & Household Goods Assistance for our Neighbors: When hurricanes strike, water heaters or pipes fail, or fire breaks out, area residents can find themselves without furniture, clothing, and other essentials. Under its Financial, Food & Furniture Assistance program, SVdP Naples utilizes thrift store donations to help our Collier County neighbors rebuild their lives.

Affordable Furniture, Clothing & Household Goods:

Many working families struggle with the high cost of living in Collier County. Families at all economic levels can purchase furniture and other essentials at a fraction of the retail cost at SVdP Naples Thrift Stores, helping them "stretch their dollars" to cover rent, utilities and other necessities.


